Knapton Parish Council - Chairman's Report

The current buzzword is Jubilee...

As I write this, the Parish Council team is busy planning and co-ordinating with the clubs and groups in the village to host an extraordinary village celebration for the Queen's Jubilee on the weekend of 2nd to 5th June and we want everyone to be part of it. With everything from a street party to the lighting of the beacon in its new home, we want everyone to remember this four-day event for many years to come. If you'd like to be involved let us know, the more the merrier!

We are also fast approaching the Parish Council's "end of year" in May, when our Chair, Vice-Chair and officers are elected and committees re-confirmed. I believe that our councillors can look back with satisfaction at what they have achieved over the last ten months in what were very difficult circumstances. In many ways it's been a good year with many of our projects successfully completed and most notably the 30mph limit in Hall Lane is nearing completion, but circumstances beyond our control has meant that one longer-term project has still not implemented, namely the remodelling of the junction.

Currently we are working with Anglian Water who are installing the new sewerage system and County Broadband as we seek to implement a parish wide broadband solution that will meet and exceed our resident's on-line demands for years to come.

We believe that everything we do is for the good of the parish, because we serve the parish and all its residents. We do this by adopting an honest and transparent approach so as to involve as many of our parishioners as we can at every stage and it's very pleasing to see more people contacting us by email and on social media and coming to share their thoughts at our monthly council meetings. We like feedback, whether it's on social media, email or our Contact Form on the website. Parish Clerk's Report

March 2022

Once again, the Parish Council team is working hard behind the scenes to make Knapton a better and safer village to live in as it progresses several road and safety initiatives.

The transfer of land title deed for the Car Park has finally been agreed and signed by our Chair and Vice-Chair, Pat Lee. After much negotiation and to-ing and fro-ing between Knapton PC and The Victory Housing Trust, the Parish Council will now take ownership of the car park and tidying up can begin.

There is also at last progress on the speed limit extension (30mph extended down Hall Lane as far as Butterfly Walk). This again is the result of very hard work by our Chair and it looks as if it really is close to coming.

We are, together with Swafield and Mundesley Parish Councils, collecting evidence of speed of vehicles using the B1145 between Swafield and Mundesley. This will be used to try to get stricter speed restrictions implemented on this bit of road and our Chair is fighting to get this extended to include Pond Lane.

Plans for the Platinum Jubilee celebrations (weekend of 2nd-5th June) are under way. The beacon has been registered for lighting at 9.45pm on 2nd June and permission has been given to erect it in the churchyard. A few volunteers are working hard to make this a wonderful and memorable weekend for Knapton. As plans are cemented there will be much information coming your way.

It appears that North Walsham is going to receive a very large amount of new housing. Knapton Parish Council has shown support to NNDC for affordable housing but opposition to more second homes.

It can be seen by all that work continues on the mains drainage installation. Elizabeth Winter has been a marvellous 'liaison officer' between Anglia Water and the village, and they are doing their best to minimise inconvenience. As always unexpected problems have been encountered and have to be overcome.

We hope to see very many of you at the Jubilee celebrations.

Pump station is progressing well - we will be starting the layby in early April.

We will be pressure testing the rising main next week - this is all installed now.

We are making better progress on The Street by utilising the directional drilling rig - we expect the drill rig to return in April and this will bring us up to Lawn Close.

The Knapton Green Road closure is still planned for April once we are finished in the garden near the existing Anglian Water pump station (near our main compound).



PURPLE TREE

I am Bea Gatfield and have been living in Knapton for the last 24 years. I am married to Andy and have three (now grown up) children. We all love it here, and although our children are involved in their own ventures, they all enjoy coming back to the peace of this beautiful village.

Having spent the last 14 years working in Education, with the last 5 years teaching in a Special Educational Needs (SEN) School where I taught in Key Stage 2, 3 and 4, (previously at Paston College I supported students at Key Stage 5 in English and Psychology), I have now decided to start my own business – Purple Tree.

My business has two strands – one is about tutoring students. Those in Primary School I am able to teach most subjects; higher in age I can tutor in English, Psychology and Sociology and can support in many subjects.

The second strand is all about Wellbeing. I have started a Mindfulness and Meditation group that meets on a Monday morning at 9:30am. We spend 45 minutes learning Mindfulness and slotting in one or two meditations, and then we have cups of tea/coffee and biscuits and a good old chat (the second 45 minutes is optional but builds a lovely group atmosphere). This is held in 'The Dell' at my home – Highbank House.

I have also recently started a Yoga and Mindfulness session at the Village Hall where the focus is very much on the mind/body connection. This is held on Fridays from 2:30 for an hour. As space is limited I am only able to fit in 8 people at present and the class is already fully booked, but if there is enough interest I would certainly consider putting on a second class at 3:45 – 4:45pm. About 10 years ago I did a Neuro-Linguistic Programming course and became a qualified NLP Practitioner and Wellbeing Coach and I completed my degree in 2015 in Psychology with Social Science. I have completed various Mindfulness courses and regularly practise what I preach as it has proven so incredibly helpful to me personally. I have been doing Yoga for over 20 Years and taught the students at my last school both yoga and Mindfulness on a weekly basis. I do also see clients on a 1:1 basis and am able to offer Eye Movement Neuro-integration to enable the proper dispersal of trauma events.

The Bells of St Peter and St Paul's Parish Church Knapton

The Church of St Peter and St Paul is very fortunate to possess an excellent ring of 6 bells, hung for English style "Full Circle" ringing.

The largest bell (tenor) weighs approximately 5.5 cwt (280 kgs) which actually makes them a "light" ring of bells and hence relatively easy to ring. Two of the bells (5 and 6) date from the middle of the 16th century and were cast by Norwich bell founder John Brand. It is possible that they were actually cast in the church-yard or a nearby field as many bells at this time were cast "on site".

Bells 2, 3, and 4 were recast by Gillett and Johnson of Croydon, in 1932 from three 19th century (Mears of London) bells. The bells were returning in a new steel and cast-iron frame to replace the original wooden structure which had become very unstable due, mainly to neglect and the fact that the rainwater poured through the leaking Tower roof. The bells had not been rung for at least 50 years prior to this restoration. The "new" treble bell (Whitechapel Bell Foundry) dated 1990 was the generous gift of former Knapton resident and Bell ringer Miss Dorothy Margett, which she gave in memory of her Godfather.

We (The Band) have been unable to ring for the last two years, because of restrictions, especially with our small enclosed ringing chamber. It is likely that some team members will not return for a variety of reasons, including one who sadly passed away recently, who will be sad-
