Knapton Village Pond Project

Restoring, creating and managing ponds for wildlife

We are all privileged to live Knapton in many ways, but how many of us know about our secretive little neighbours that live in the **Village Pond** on the edge of **Wilds Way**.

Great Crested Newts are a protected species and the **Parish Council** are about to embark on a very special project to ensure their long term safety and to make sure that we all live happily ever after side by side. The PC has teamed up with **Norfolk Coast** and the **Norfolk Ponds Project** to create a learning environment where by helping to build it, children learn about the world around them, and they want all the children and parents in School Close and Wilds Way in particular to get involved. The project will;

- **make the pond as safe as we can** so that our younger residents can enjoy it
- **design info boards** to go onto the fence
- **make the path through the trees** (which forms part of the "Permissible Path" from Knapton to Knapton Green) as safe as possible
- **expand the "Bug Hotel"** that currently exists in a small clearing so that parents and children can get involved to learn more about the world around us

- **add seating** in the area
- **plant a small orchard area** so that the space is used positively

2024 promises to be a year of fresh challenges sprinkled with a healthy dose of optimism. The Parish Council has had a busy few months since our last meeting at the beginning of December, as you can see...

- Jackie liaised with Highways to deal with the main drains because of excess water on The Street
- we negotiated with the school bus operators to add the bus shelter in Wilds Way as an additional stop to make drop off and pick up points safer for all our children, most of whom are on School Close/Wilds Way
- we also added a salt bin at the bus shelter to help to prevent anyone, particularly young children, slipping into the road
- we're working with a mum in School Close to try and get permission from Victory Housing to put a new playground for the under 7s on the grass area at the junction of Wilds Way/School Close, and if we're successful our resident will establish a local group to choose the play units and we will source the funding
- we approached Victory Housing for a solution to resolve a damaged path in School Close that is used by elderly residents and maybe add some lighting
- Liz and Denise worked with Highways to replace the post outside the Village Hall that was knocked over, to prevent the Loke being used as a rat run
- we started a conversation with a charity to render the pond next to Wilds Way safer for our local children and to encourage a wild-life area and small orchard, whilst at the same time preserve the habitat for a protected species
- we considered an unusual housing planning application
- we liaised with Anglian Water to establish the cause of unpleasant smells in The Street
- we monitored the installation of the re-modelled village junction
- we collected the latest vehicle speed figures on Hall Lane from our SAM2 camera and opened the next round of discussions with Highways to find a way of slowing down the traffic on Hall Lane

Whilst we don't usually meet in January, we were unable to meet in February this year either due to Jackie and I not being able to attend and the resulting concerns over quorum (having the minimum number of councillors required to hold a meeting).

There are currently two vacant seats on the council and we want to recruit two Knapton residents to bring us back up to full strength, so if you would like to know more about what we do and how to get involved please get in touch with Denise, our clerk, or visit the "Why be a Parish Councillor" page in the PC section of our website. We'd love to hear from you.

Over the next few months, I hope to see the relationship between local committees, groups, residents and the new Trustees of the MADRA mix and merge into a positive relationship which will benefit everyone. Clearly there are views, feelings and opinions on all sides that will need to mellow for that to happen but I'm confident that we will **all** get there, smiling **together**. The Parish Council will do all it can, when it can, to help make that happen.

Dear Mrs Winter,

The lives of seriously injured and ill people across East Anglia are being saved today because of you and your fantastic fundraising. Thanks to donations from churches like yours, friends and family will receive the expert critical care they need in an emergency, support with their recovery and, as well as this, people in the community will be able to learn the life-saving skills of how to deliver CPR – St Peter & St Paul's Church Knapton really is making a difference.

Your kind donation of **£152.00** arrived in the office, and we thank you so much; East Anglian Air Ambulance (EAAA) couldn't save lives without you. Please pass on our heartfelt thanks to everyone who contributed to your fundraising in any way. Together you really will save lives.

Your donation will support patients like Jonathan, who suffered a catastrophic injury whilst working on a local farm. His wife Wendy said, "We know that without the enhanced skills of the air ambulance team that day Jonathan wouldn't have made it to hospital." Like you, Jonathan and Wendy also know how much work goes into fundraising for the air ambulance that saved his life, having organised their own charity ball event a year after the accident.

Or your donation could be put towards delivering free 1-hour bystander CPR and AED training sessions for local people to become confident in giving CPR and using a defibrillator (AED) on a loved one in cardiac arrest. Like Mark, who received CPR from his wife Melanie, after going into cardiac arrest whilst he slept. Mark said: "If you don't know how to do CPR, we would encourage you to learn as this really can happen to anyone, but you can survive, and you can help to save a life."

Thank you for choosing to give your support and donation to the patients of EAAA – we really appreciate you. We look forward to keeping you up to date about the patients your donations have helped.

Hello everyone,

Well, I wish people would stop doing the rain dance, whenever will it stop, I think it has to do with Global Warming, not all your dancing!! I grow in raised beds so the rain does not affect me too much. The allotments drain quite well in most places there are only a few boggy areas. It has been ploughed already on one of our rare dry days by our hardworking. There is a lot to do this time of year, buying your seeds , putting them in and waiting for them to germinate, the greens especially as they need a long growing season, we have just stated picking and eating our broccoli and it does taste good.

Peppers and chilli seeds can be sown as they need an early start and need some heat. Tomatoes and cucumbers need to be sown later as they can get too drawn.

We are still eating our homemade Tomato soup and Pasta sauce , we had an amazing bumper crop of tomatoes and peppers last year. We are also still enjoying our carrots grown in pots, so it has been fresh sweet carrots all year round. Big tick for my husband !!

Our Peach tree and Apricot tree in the polytunnel our full of blossom . We had 11 peaches last year, it will be interesting to see how many we will have this year, and how many apricots we will have on our new tree, so we wait and see, very exciting because there is nothing as good as fruit picked straight from the tree or bush, like you first strawberry, now there is something to look forward to, it is making my mouth water !!

We have two new allotment holder this year so it will be interesting to see the new ideas they bring with them.

It is a very exciting time of the year all the spring flowers and all the things you forgot were under the ground just starting to pop up so much to look forward to .We are so lucky to live in Knapton.

Hope you all have a good growing year and enjoy all your produce.
