Message from Alan Young - past Chairman of Knapton Parish Council



Land off School Close: Development appears to have temporarily halted, possibly due to the recent `dig` carried out by NNDC, where artefacts and ancient foundations were discovered.

The clerk presented a financial report showing a current credit balance of £14, 623 including an NNDC grant of £11,817 to fund the refurbishment of the playground, currently under way.

A defibrillator was to be purchased (kindly funded by the Fete Committee) and would be sited on the east wall of the village hall.

Work was under way to tidy up the grounds of the Men's Club.

The presence of two caravans parked on land at Madra had been noted.

The path from Knapton to Mundesley was being mowed and was believed to be used regularly.


