# THE QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE WEEKEND 2ND - 5TH JUNE 2022

Knapton Parish Council's wish was to bring together the whole village by working with all the village's clubs, committees and groups for the four days of celebrations for the Queen's Jubilee starting on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> June.

The weekend of festivities and celebration encompassed the whole of the parish, young and old alike! Including those new to the village, this was an opportunity to meet our neighbours and make new friend. It was certainly a weekend to remember, we lost count of how many were at the first night but the rough estimate was over 350 people of all ages! Wow what a great turnout, one resident commented that seeing so many people walking up The Street and then more coming towards her made her quite emotional. For those who could not be with us we kicked off the Jubilee weekend celebrations with a party evening set in the Church, with live bands, BBQ and Bar. Mal and Emily did a fantastic job organising then cooking and serving over 320 burgers/hotdogs, Mal you are a village heroine.

The Village Beacon was erected in the Church yard and together with others across Norfolk was lit at 9.45pm. Below is the Beacon with the inscription that Alan Young sorted. The erection of the Beacon followed by the filling of the basket was all thanks to volunteers, mainly Pat Lee, Alan Young and Mike Risebrow. We were required to get permission from the Norwich Diocese which means it now has a permanent home.

On the other days, there was a History display, titled "Knapton through the Years", a Craft Display including a copy of the 1939 Census and June Wild's written account of which families lived in the village in 1953, there was a Craft Display by the Knitters and Stitchers with demonstrations, a report from Jean Clark with photos appears later in the news. Flower arrangements, were brought by lots of ladies from around the village, a big thank you to them too. There was Coffee and Cake in the Village Hall, from 10 to 4pm with a Tombola, a big thank you to Kathryn and Clair for organising this event and Sheila who manned the Tombola which sold out by lunchtime. Thanks to everyone who donated Cakes and Tombola prizes!

In addition on the Friday afternoon at 2pm Mario from Mundesley First Responders come and gave a demonstration on using the Defibrillator which is positioned by the main door to the Village Hall. He has offered to come back at a later date if there are anymore residents who would like to know how to use the Defibrillator.

On the Saturday, there was a Special Street Party for the younger members of our village. It was held on the Grass area of School Close/ Wild's Way, where the children enjoyed village games which Keith and Alan had set up and music thanks to Andy. Due to the windy conditions Monika and Lucy who organised a fantastic afternoon brought the Tea Party into the Village Hall. Following the tea they all returned to the green for a Tug of War which the parents joined in to. We must say a grateful thanks to Anglian Water for their generous donation of £200 which went towards the Children's Party.

The Sunday Village Walk was sadly cancelled due to expected bad weather which was a shame for MADRA who had volunteered to host coffee before and a Bar-B-Que afterwards.

During the who three days there were collection bucket around the events and the proceeds from the Coffee Morning and Tombola were donated to The Mundesley First Responders and in total a cheque was sent for £187.6op, thank you Knapton.

# **Knapton Parish Council - Chairman's Report**

"It's not the place that maketh the person, but the person that maketh the place..."

When the Roman philosopher *Marcus Tullius Cicero* wrote that sometime before he was beheaded in 43BC, he must have just got back from a time travel jaunt to our village over the Platinum Jubilee weekend because between the 2nd and 4th June our parishioners were living proof that his quote was a statement of fact. Over 80% of our residents got together and punched well above their weight to produce an incredibly special Jubilee celebration that will remain in their memory for many years to come.

I'm told it's the first time that the Church, MADRA and all the various village clubs, committees and groups have worked together so closely with the Parish Council to produce an extraordinary series of events for a very long time. Which is a shame because we obviously do it so well...

I believe that as one, our village shrugged off the cloud of apathy that's hung over it for far too long and found the spirit that we always believed was there. And having seen thirty-eight young Knaptonians running around, bubble pots in hand, playing old village games that I'm pretty sure none of them had seen before, climbing trees and having the time of their lives, I reckon our village's future is in safe hands!

Although the Jubilee celebrations were obviously our marquee event, we've made other stuff happen as well;

- the new 30mph speed limit extension from the MADRA to the Butterfly Walk car park in Hall Lane has finally gone live, almost three years after we got it approved by Highways
- we are working with Highways on the final designs for the re-modelling of the Knapton Road / Hall Lane junction, another scheme that we got approved almost three years ago
- we've started working with Swafield and Mundesley parish councils to try to implement a speed limit reduction along the Knapton Road under a NCC Highways scheme that opens in November.
- under the same scheme we are also trying to get the speed limit reduced on Pond Lane from a ridiculous 6omph down to a safer 30mph
- we're working with Anglian Water as they install the First Time Sewerage System for the village
- we're keeping in touch with County Broadband as they attempt to implement a parish wide Superfast Broadband solution
- and... we are trying to find our missing telephone box!

Add into the mix new salt bins, hedge and verge cutting issues, a playground refurbishment programme, footpath maintenance problems and a tree planting programme that all residents can get involved in, we're where we always are... working for a better tomorrow.

I'd also like to thank Alan Young, who resigned in May, for his enormous, selfless contribution to the Parish Council and the village as a whole. As a stalwart for many years he will be sorely missed.

The Parish Council worked hard to bring the whole weekend together. They got the beacon moved to the churchyard well done Elizabeth Winter for getting permission for that, Alan Young for magically moving it and Pat Lee for arranging the necessary digger and auger to pop it into place. Various celebrations, with Mal Lees doing a barbeque for over three hundred people (after four hours of onion peeling and caramelising) and of course the wonderful band which got us all dancing in the church. I don't suppose the Angels had seen the like in all their five hundred years! So many people helped that I won't start to name them. I hope I have written to all helpers, but if I missed anyone, sing out and I will quickly put it right. The weekend was a huge success, bringing so many people together and making Knapton feel like the lovely village it is to live in. I understand the rest of the weekend has been written up, so will leave it at that except to say that our tireless chairman seemed to be everywhere all over the three days of festivities.

Our Chairman has finally been able to celebrate the extension of the 30 mph limit in Hall Lane. Unfortunately Highways did not get it quite right but have promised to come racing back and make certain it extends to the Butterfly Walk. Well done Peter, it has been a long, hard struggle.

Finally the PC has become the owner of the car park. Pat Lee and Peter Neatherway then filled watering cans and gave the resident weeds a hard time. The car park is now looking very neat.

At our next meeting Cally Keohane of Highways Assistance Team is coming to give a talk about Highways. This will start at 6.00 on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> July in the Village Hall, and we hope you will come and hear what she has to say.

Summer is a relatively quiet time for the Parish Council, but there are things bubbling away to keep us occupied for the rest of the year. Our councillors put in a lot of hard work for the village and I personally would like to give them a big `thank you`. They really do make a difference.

# **Knapton First Time Sewerage Scheme**

Electrical install at the pump station will started on the 13th June with- control kiosk being delivered.

Open cut on The Street is progressing towards the junction with Lawn Close. We can no longer use the drill rig (ditch witch) because the pipe gradient is flatter than previously so back to slower open cut techniques.

We have a gang working on The Street installing laterals to properties. We have road notice which started on Lawn Close w/c 20<sup>th</sup> June.

Work on The Green/Trunch Road is complete. We have another gang installing pipes in the back of White House Farm.

We are currently expecting to be complete by the end of November.
