St Peter and St Paul's Church Update

The work on the Church repairs are proceeding at quite a pace. The contractors have finished the repairs to the west side of the Tower and the Parapets have been repaired and rendered both inside and out.







They are now working on the south face of the Tower. The whole of the area where the clock is has been taken back by a complete course of stones. There is also a bad crack to the depth of about 500mm and this will all be repaired.



On 12 July, the Ladies from the Heritage Lottery Fund came to visit the Church. It was their first visit to a

project. They went up the Tower to see the work being carried out and I took the opportunity to go with them so I could see everything for myself.



As I reported in last quarter's Knapton News, the Grave Covers have been moved into the Chancel. The new floor base and the pipe work for the disabled toilet and kitchenette have been put in place. The water pipe has been laid to the road, the pipes have been inspected and we now await Anglia Water to come and make the connection to the mains.

We anticipate having the Church open for two hours on 20 August whilst the Garage/Yard Sale to raise funds for the Village Hall takes place around the village.

Church Wardens' Whispers

Services have been well attended and we have enjoyed having members of Gimmingham Church join us on quite a few Sundays. This is all part of the new rota for services which means that Knapton continue to have services on most Sundays, going to Gimmingham every other month. On Sunday 26 June, the Church celebrated the Patronal Festival. The service was let by Betty Taylor with Revd. Ralph Webb preaching. An invitation was sent to our Methodist friends and I am pleased to report that five joined us for the service.

There has been one funeral, Mr Mervyn Fawkes, a long term resident of Knapton. His family wanted him to be buried in Knapton Churchyard, where the rest of the family are also buried. The location of the family graves caused a small problem as the new drains and soakaways are in the same area. However, a suitable site was decided on, allowing for the works that have still to be completed.

Ace Cultural Tours brought coach parties to visit the Church on 15 June and again on 6 July.



Seal and Shore Watch



What would you do if you see a seal on the beach or anything else that you weren't expecting?

Many people have unexpectedly seen marine life on the beach and genuinely have no idea what to do or think about it. This new group, Seal and Shore Watch, are dedicated to the wellbeing and protection of our seals and other marine life along our beautiful coastline.

If you see a marine mammal, sea bird or any other marine life that you think may be in difficulty, please do ring to discuss it rather than just walking away and not giving it any further thought, as this may cost a life without you realising it.

It is our intention that one day, Seal and Shore Watch (SASW) will operate around the entire British coastline. However, for the moment, we are concentrating on the North Norfolk coast and will be available for help and advice 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

It is not our intention for you to actually get 'hands on'. We simply require your help to watch and report your sightings or concerns to us. We have access to trained and insured medics, who are able to come out to a rescue within a short period of time. They can then assess the animal and decide if further care is needed. There are rescue facilities that are able to take in sick, injured or abandoned animals which can give treatment and release them back into the wild when ready.

This is something you can do, free of charge, as you walk along the beach just simply enjoying your day. We would just like to advise that most animals can become distressed and frightened if approached and that it is best to keep a good distance from them. Animals can carry diseases and cause nasty bites to both human and dogs.

A knock on the door of the Coastwatch Lookout on Beach Road. A concerned member of the public asks, "Do you know that there's a seal on the beach? I wonder if it is ok?"

This is an increasingly common situation facing the volunteer watchkeepers at Mundesley. Senior watchkeeper, Stephanie, decided to take matters into her own hands and find a more effective way of helping marine and bird life on the beach at Mundesley and surrounding areas.

Stephanie went off to be trained by British Divers Marine Life Rescue to become a marine medic. A basic recue kit from the Sea Life Centre at Hunstanton, Steph has rescued 18 seals. On four of these rescues, Coast Watch personnel were also involved.

Now Stephanie is encouraging like-minded people to come forward to join Seal and Shore Watch. The new group's main aim is to keep a watch on our shores and to help protect and preserve marine, mammal and bird life.

"We need the people who use our lovely beaches to be aware of just how dangerous litter can be to our marine life too," commented Stephanie. "Empty crisp packets look like a tempting snack to a seal but can prove to be deadly. Discarded fishing lines equally so."

"If people do spot an animal in distress our new group can help. "Better still, why not join us!" she added.
