A short reminder that the Parish Council meets on the first Tuesday of most months of the year except August and January. This year there is no November meeting.

The Parish Council would like to welcome five new households to the village, Mark and Lyn in St Peter's Close, two new families in The Street, one in Lawn Close and one In Paston Road. We hope they will enjoy living here and would love to see them at any village activities.

The development of the Millennium Field is going ahead. The name for the new road has been confirmed by NNDC as Wilds Way. The Parish Council is grateful for this suggestion. Pity some driver mistook the hedge for the road!

The Village Hall Car park has been completed, looking very smart, but not yet in use.

Work on the playground is complete. The new equipment has proved popular with both visiting and local children and the Parish Council extend their thanks to Pat Lee, Peter Neatherway and Alan Young, who have given up a great deal of their time to this project. We are also grateful to NNDC, whose grants enabled the project to go ahead.

We are hoping to raise funding for a SAM2 machine to discourage speeding in the village, especially in Hall Lane.

The allotments are all let. Our thanks to Pat and Jenny Lee, who collected the rents and generally keep an overall eye on the allotments.

The land in the churchyard to the east of the path to Knapton Church has now been cut and tidied. The Parish Council were pleased to fund this work.

September is upon us. We all have had a limited amount of produce, vegetables coming out of our ears, runner beans, French beans ,berlotte beans to dry ready for winter soups.

Courgettes have been abundant, what do you do with them all, there is a very yummy cake you can make but it is not for every day, but I have used them instead of lasagne sheets, steamed for a few minutes, layered with our homemade pasta sauce of course," boasting now", with cheese sauce on top, very nice.

The tomatoes and peppers and aubergines have been amazing, I have frozen pounds, the trusses are dripping with the smaller sweet ones they should last us for another few months, all the sun we have had has made a tremendous difference. There is tomato soup, yummy with crusty bread, ratatouille, and fresh tomato pasta sauce in the freezer.

Everyone is pleased with their produce, carrots taste so sweet, and the sweet corn is looking very good, the kale and cabbages also. The brussels are getting quite big, I think we will have some for Christmas dinner. The summer seems to have flown by, we are all preparing our growing beds for next season, compost on, and covering them up to stop the weeds taking hold.

I hope you all have had a good season of growing whatever it may be, as our allotment holders have.


